# Evening language programme – STEP INTO 2023/24

## Course title: Step into Ancient Greek – online

### Dates/Times:

Wednesdays, 18:30-19:30, from w/c 29<sup>th</sup> April (10 weeks, except 29<sup>th</sup> May)

### Course descriptor/objectives

This non-credit bearing weekly course is intended for motivated 6<sup>th</sup> formers who wish to explore Ancient Greek for the first time.

By the end of this 10-week course (10 hours) participants will be able to:

- i. Understand basic grammar of Ancient Greek.
- ii. Have an appreciation of 5<sup>th</sup> century Athenian culture and history, realizing the contribution made by ancient Greeks to today's world.

In seminars, participants will have to engage in practical exercises and group interaction in order to develop relevant language-specific learning strategies. The role of the instructor, who is DBS-checked, is to facilitate this process, provide useful tools and encourage participants to become independent learners and basic users of the languages too.

### Language-specific information:

The Ancient Greek language includes the forms of Greek used in ancient Greece and the ancient world from around 1500 BC to 300 BC. It was the

languages of Homer and Athenian historians, playwrights, and philosophers. Ancient Greek has contributed many words to English and other languages and has been a standard subject of study in educational institutions of the Western World since the renaissance. In modern times, Ancient Greek has influenced the naming of technical terms in many European languages, and it's possible to find modern works translated into Ancient Greek, including some volumes of *Asterix* and even *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone!*\*
